







Authentic: True, or accurate; not fake or copied.






Critical thinking: Spotting if something isn't right online, by










Deceptive: Trying to make someone believe something that is untrue.


Encrypted: When information or data is converted into a code.






Firewall: A computer program that protects it from most scams and


 tricks.










Fraud: A trick to get something from someone.

computer or server.




Misinformation: Things online that could be untrue - which can

Phishing: When someone tricks you into sharing your login or






Scam: A dishonest attempt to make money or get something of








Spearphishing: A phishing scam where someone targets you by using
